

HOW TO GET THERE

FROM THE STATION: Leave through the booking hall and then the pedestrian exit on the right. You will see a statue close by - it is of Thomas Cook, whose first ever tour started from Leicester Station. Walk past the statue, cross Station Street, and continue alongside the ring road (Waterloo Way). Cross Campbell Street and pass the brightly coloured Premier Inn. You will see a pedestrian crossing over the ring road just beyond the entrance to Puregym. Use the crossings over both carriageways to an island in the middle of the junction with Charles Street. Bear right and cross at a third set of pedestrian lights to find yourself facing an imposing building, the former City Police Headquarters. Turn to your left and walk around the frontage to continue along Charles Street until you reach the first major junction, with Rutland Street. You will see City Hall ahead. Turn right into Rutland Street. You will see the Athena at the end of the road - walk towards it. When you have nearly reached it, you will see an unusual modern building on your left. This is the Curve Theatre.

BY CAR: The NCP Rutland Centre Car Park is next door to the Curve Theatre. A reduced rate is available to users who are Curve Theatre customers. To pay this rate, present your car park ticket at the theatre cafe or ticket office to be validated. However, delegates are advised that this facility is likely to be very busy due to another event at the theatre on the same day.
