

## **Our Website Wins Major Award**



On July 16, at the national rail-campaigning group Railfuture's A.G.M. in Bristol, Friends of the West Highland Lines won the Gold Award 2021/22, *Best Website for a Rail User Group*.

The website was launched in 2009. It has been a work in progress ever since until it has become the award winning website it is today. In presenting the prizes, Railfuture Chairman Chris Page commented: "it was great that this award should go to a Rail User Group who work on the periphery of Britain's Rail Network." Railfuture is recognised as being the main organisation campaigning for improved railway services throughout Great Britain. FWHL Secretary Fraser McDonald said: "It is wonderful that our society should receive this honour. It reflects the hard work that has gone into building the website over the years. The FWHL Committee is very grateful to Committee member John McCormick and local Helensburgh web designer Jim Chestnut for the early days of the site. Also, former Committee member Norman McNab who toiled for many hundreds of hours also building and overseeing the launch and operation of our brilliant website, along with web production expert Jim Campbell and latterly former Committee member Gordon Webster. Thanks are also due to the current Website Manager David Crossley who continues to improve and extend the site which thoroughly deserves this award. David also manages our Facebook and Twitter accounts."
