Railfuture Document Reference Scheme

The objective is to ensure that every document, whether internal or external, historic or future, hard copy or electronic, created by Railfuture or received by Railfuture, is provided with a unique identifier so that it can be logged and retrieved, without creating additional administrative effort. Therefore the document reference scheme must:

- be easy to understand
- not require anyone to allocate references in advance eg from a register
- enable allocation by the author
- work with PODIO
- make it easy to file, archive and retrieve electronic documents

Every document should carry a reference in the following format:

AAA-BBB-20140302-C

where:

- AAA represents the business function responsible for the document. This would be either part of the organisation, eg BRD = Board, LSE = London and South East branch, PAS = Passenger Group; or a business activity eg SUB = Submission, CNF = Conference. See full list below.
- BBB represents the originator of the document. This would be an individual for a document created by Railfuture, eg RWB = Roger Blake; or an organisation for a document created externally, eg ORR = Office of Rail Regulation.
- 20130302 is the date in ISO format (ie reversed). It should be the operative date for the document, eg the date of the meeting rather than the date the document was produced in this case 2nd March 2013, the date of the board meeting when this proposal should be considered.
- C is an optional suffix letter to distinguish documents created by the same originator relating to the same business function on the same day, eg Board papers.

The reference should form the first part of the filename for all electronic documents, and should be shown in the header or footer on each page.
