

What is this 'GRIP' process?

GRIP is the Governance for Railway Investment Projects

• What is the Preferred Option?

The preferred option is to operate four carriage trains eve

• Where will Portishead station be?

Land was set aside for the station more than ten years

• When will trains start running?

GRIP 3 proposes trains running from January 2017.

• Why is it going to take so long?

Portishead will be the largest town in the country without a rail link when the current house building programme is complete. A further 8,000 people are expected to settle in the area over the next few years making Portishead the second largest town in North Somerset.

We believe that there is a **strong case** for reopening the whole line for passenger use


