

- Bristol to Severn Beach +1tph via Avonmouth (December 2021 - December 2024)
- Bristol to Westbury via Keynsham and Bath +1tph (May 2023 to May 2026)
- Bristol to Gloucester +1tph via Filton Abbey Wood and Bristol Parkway (May 2023 to May 2026)
- Commitment from DfT to fund new 1tph Bristol to Portishead and Bristol to Henbury rail services post-opening

Severn Estuary

This area contains strengths in net zero energy transition and logistics. Green energy capabilities include tidal, nuclear, hydrogen and off-shore which can play a nationally significant role in green energy transition

West Innovation Arc

This zone includes the UK's major aerospace R&D hub, National Composite Centre, the Isambard AI supercomputer, and a range of other innovation assets. This innovation growth zone incorporates many of our regional capabilities, supporting the transition to net zero and creation of green jobs.

Bristol & Bath Growth Zone

This high-tech innovation, digital and creative growth zone includes our national assets and specialist skills in AI and quantum technology. Including the new Bristol Temple Quarter district and innovation hub, Bristol and Bath's media sectors and the broader tech and creative strengths of the centre of Bristol

Somer Valley

This zone contains our regional strengths in net zero manufacturing and rural productivity incubation. It can serve as a blueprint for driving rural productivity growth nationally.
