




Hertfordshire




Rail Journeys

- 85% of these journeys are to London (inc City 37%, Westminster 22%, Camden 11%)

- Work with train operators







Abbey Line

- Watford Junction to St Albans Abbey
- Single track
- One train every 45 minutes
- Community Rail Partnership (2005)
- 450,000 pax per year (up 20% since CRP)







Abbey Line Light Rail Conversion

- Convert to light rail operation
- Add passing loop
- Responsibility for running line passes to HCC
- Operator to run service for HCC
- Increase frequency to every 30 mins



Abbey Line Light Rail Conversion

- Four operators shortlisted
- New service could start at end of 2011



Croxley Rail Link

- Links Metropolitan Line with closed Croxley Green branch to Watford Junction
- 4.5 km of "new" railway
- 400 metre new viaduct
- Two new stations
- Closure of Watford Metropolitan
- 6 8 trains per hour






Croxley Rail Link - Benefits

Watford Rail Hub




