

First of all, well done to Okehampton, by the time you are reading this, a regular GWR service for every two hours is now fully operational! The first in the governments 'Restoring your railway' programme. By next year the Exeter to Okehampton Dartmoor line will move to an hourly service, I look forward to catching a Barnstaple to Exeter train changing at Crediton for my first ride to see the beautiful hills, streams and walkways of Dartmoor.

During the unveiling of our Bideford nameplate at the Burton art gallery, our town mayor gave a speech saying that he would like to see the real railway return to Bideford. I remember seeing our chairman's eyes looking over to me...

I have become a member of Railfuture, an organisation responsible for helping communities across the UK with gaining them a better service and or reopening their railway. Railfuture invited me to a director's meeting and to give a presentation, they already had tried in the past to reopen the Barnstaple to Bideford line and they were keen to get me going. Tarka Rail Association is an organisation that supports the interests of the passengers and service on the Barnstaple to Exeter line. They support our aspirations to extend the line to Bideford. I was honoured to join their committee and talk with Network Rail and GWR.

Restoring Your Railway is the name for the current government's £500 million programme that lets communities bid to get their railways reinstated; the director of Railfuture would like to see Bideford added to that programme. North Devon District Council have now asked me to make a presentation, as well as Bideford Town Council who would also like to see a Barnstaple to Bideford railway committee formed by January. If all goes well we will have a Barnstaple to Bideford railway added to the new North Devon and Torridge Local Plan (a mainline service separate to BRHC). The good news is likeminded councillors are present in Barnstaple and they want to bring down the traffic congestion from private car usage.

Greater Bideford Parkway

Many questions are still to be answered; will it be a through service to Exeter and beyond? Will the railway need a new alignment and possibly go through new cuttings and embankments? What stations will it serve? Can we have a faster service than ever before? I have thought through catchment areas and why people would need to board or step off from Barnstaple to Bideford. The true scale of housing development has made me realise that Yelland has a need for a parkway, Instow has a need for a station to serve tourism and Greater Bideford has a need to serve thousands of residents and tourists.

The area of Instow has a pinch Point. The train must continue through the cutting. The Tarka Trail could be improved by re-routing it through Instow seafront.

What we will need to form is a Strategic Outline Business case and that would include a signed letter from DCC's official officer in charge of Restoring your railway, a feasibility study, a commercial study and a wider economic study for starters (I hope to get some more people to help me by then).

But what is the name of the group? 'ACE Rail' will be the committee's working name. We will aim to provide a heavy rail, mainline service to Exeter.

The figures for Greater Bideford (Northam, Appledore and Westward Ho!) are very interesting, only the regular bus route along the B3233, the number 21 bus takes 29 minutes to service 40,000 people while a private car user can be in Barnstaple in 17 minutes.
