What shall we be doing this month?

London and South East regional branch members, and / or committee members, will be:-

- ~ attending the final six <u>drop-in and online events</u> for East West Rail's latest non-statutory consultation.
- ~ running a L&SE regional branch / Kent Division campaigns stall at the <u>annual show</u> of Erith Model Railway Society, near Abbey Wood station.
- ~ participating in the third in-person Transport Forum of Transport for the South East.
- ~ holding regular meetings of our Herts & Beds and Eastern Divisions online, Sussex & Coastway and London Metro Divisions in-person.
- ~ contributing to composite Railfuture responses to the non-statutory consultation by East West Rail and to the DfT's Call for Ideas to support the development of an Integrated National Transport Strategy for England.
- ~ responding to Brighton & Hove City Council's consultation on Key Issues for City Plan 2041.

Our vision for Railfuture: An independent organisation whose views are respected by the rail industry, to which decision makers come for advice, which rail users are proud to join and recommend.

Britain's Growing Railway in London and South East: January birthdays

- ~ 5th, in 1981 restoration of passenger services from Barking into Gospel Oak instead of Kentish Town, after a 55-year break.
- ~ 8th, in 1996 Ashford International connected to the European high-speed network when Eurostar began serving the station, but withdrawal of services from Kent's two stations continues indefinitely.

Our vision for rail: A railway system that provides services which travellers and freight forwarders want to use, and which offers more journey opportunities to more people and more freight.

- participated in Southeast CRP's North Downs Line Steering Group.
- ~ participated in a webinar to launch TfSE's new <u>Transport Strategy</u>.
- ~ participated in a GWR webinar for stakeholders.
- ~ attended a test run of GWR's class 230 battery train along the West Ealing-Greenford branch line.



- ~ responded to Network Rail Property's consultation "It's time" for Liverpool Street station. "Overwhelming support" from passengers subsequently reported for the station improvement elements of the proposals.
- ~ attended further public drop-in events for the latest non-statutory consultation by <u>East West Rail Company</u>.
- ~ held regular meetings of our Sussex & Coastway and Herts & Beds Divisions online.
- ~ held a regular monthly meeting of the L&SE regional branch committee, in-person for a change.
