Runways? Railways! - update

As indicated in the previous bulletin, 27 February duly saw the Secretary of State for Transport's decision - or rather interim or 'minded to' decision - on applicant Gatwick Airport Ltd's Northern Runway project. A brief guide helps focus on the aspects for Railfuture interest.

A letter published on National Infrastructure Planning's website indicates "The Secretary of State is minded to grant consent for the proposed development, subject to further information or evidence from the applicant on a number of specific issues." Furthermore "To allow time for the applicant to submit further information by 24 April 2025 and to allow for consultation on the further information with Interested Parties, the Secretary of State has set a new deadline of 27 October 2025 for her decision on this application."

Heidi Alexander's Written Statement to Parliament included this: "Given the examining authority's report, for the first time, recommends an alternative DCO which includes a range of controls on the operation of the scheme and not all the provisions have been considered during the examination, I am issuing a minded to approve decision that provides some additional time to seek views from all parties on the provisions, prior to a final decision."

The familiar question for Railfuture campaigners – any of this matters to us, why? The Examining Authority's 409-page Recommendation Report's Chapter 5 Conclusion on 'Traffic and Transport' at para. 5.4 deals almost exclusively with road traffic and parking, with only a passing reference to public transport: "as a result of the Proposed Development, there would be increased road traffic and public transport passenger journeys creating additional stress on already congested networks."

The Secretary of State's 54-page letter of 27 February to Gatwick Airport Ltd has two paragraphs on 'Rail network capacity' at paras. 88 and 89. At great length, it is clear that she shares the Examining Authority's reservations about surface access mode share.

Buried in the 459 pages of Appendices is a 188-page Recommended, or revised Development Consent Order (rDCO). What is apparent from Part 6 of this 'alternative' DCO's 'Miscellaneous and General' Section 51 'Protection of interests' and related Schedule 9 'Protective provisions' in Part 4 'For the protection of railway interests' is that it is only the interests of Network Rail as the owner, operator and maintainer of the railway's infrastructure which are within the scope of the Development Consent Order, not train operators' services using that infrastructure.


- ~ running the regional branch's campaigns stall at the annual London Festival of Railway Modelling at Alexandra Palace.
