#### Remember, remember, 30th October

Meant fixing (not blowing up!) the foundations, Treasury and a plot – the Plan for Change (December 2024). The Autumn Budget 2024 had followed the Chancellor of the Exchequer's July statement on her government's public spending inheritance. A year on, the Spending Review will end on 11 June 2025 and set resource (day-to-day) departmental budgets until 2028/29 and capital departmental budgets until 2029/30. For rail?



The Chancellor of the Exchequer's <u>Spring Statement</u> on Wednesday 26 March spoke about "revitalising the <u>Oxford Cambridge Growth Corridor</u>" and on 25 March the Rail Minister had confirmed Chiltern Railways as the operator of <u>East West Rail services</u>.

There might well be some discussion as to whether or not the new Oxford-Bletchley-Milton Keynes services really will be "the first East West Rail services" – is Chiltern Railways' Evergreen 3 already forgotten? Bicester-Oxford Parkway (originally proposed as 'Water Eaton Parkway') opened in October 2015 then Bicester-Oxford in December 2016. They might lay legitimate claim to honours for first and second spots.


Through services via New Cross Gate Down Junction to Crystal Palace and West Croydon began on 23 May.
