#### From fragmentation to re-integration

Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> May marked the next stage of the latest re-organisation of Britain's passenger rail services – and it happened in our regional branch area.



On Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> may Railfuture put out communications via a number of media channels, and the Transport Secretary issued this Written Statement.

After LNER in June 2018, Northern in March 2020, Southeastern in October 2021, TransPennine Express in May 2023 were all transferred to DfT Operator of Last Resort Holdings Ltd, First MTR South Western Trains Ltd was brought into DfT Operator Ltd (DfTO) – a public corporation of the Department for Transport.

As Railfuture national Board Director and Wessex regional branch Chair Mike Southgate said on the 22<sup>nd</sup>: "On Sunday, all that is going to happen is that SWR will have a new shareholder – and it's the DfT who have effectively been dictating many policies to SWR since the pandemic. So what has changed? SWR has already emailed its customers saying "Although the legal operator is changing, your experience won't. You'll continue to see the same branding, same services, and the same teams running your trains." That's not exactly good news, for the many passengers who want better services not more of the same.

"We recognise the financial challenges the railway faces but we also believe there are huge opportunities and much more needs to happen if public rather than private ownership is to be the success we all hope for. The Government has set out its vision for the legislative framework for the new world and has talked about the importance of Great British Railways (GBR). But that isn't going to happen for some time.

"So, we look for action before then to tackle topics like workforce terms and conditions e.g. drivers to open and close doors, improving customer service and a lot more. There are some marginal improvements which could be introduced quite quickly to demonstrate that change is possible such as following other operators and reinstating the main and suburban lines off-peak services cut during the pandemic. To finally resolve the class 701 fiasco and restore a ten-coach reliable service in the suburban area to reduce the over-crowding which is now commonplace.

"A reliable and effective railway is a key enabler to grow the economy locally and nationally, improve mobility, and to reduce carbon emissions through modal shift to rail."
