Railfuture's TOFI Test (The Opportunities For Influence)

Campaigning through consultations may well not be a phrase to inject the missing sparkle into all friends and family get-togethers but it does answer the burning question on everyone's lips "so what do <u>you</u> do?" It's the same principle: if we want to be in the conversation we first have to be in the room. If we want to be invited to be at the table it's often a good idea to have an earcatching something, uplifting and motivating, to offer.



Last month and this we're dealing with five TOFIs each. Last month it was Gatwick Airport's Northern Runway Project, the Mayor of London's new London Plan, the Eastbourne / Lewes District Councils' reorganisation, and East Sussex's draft Rail Strategy and draft Freight Strategy. This month it's for the City of London's consideration of Network Rail's Liverpool Street station redevelopment and ORR's Accessible Travel Policy, while considering what to contribute for Surrey County Council's reorganisation, Medway's pre-submission (to the Planning Inspectorate) draft Local Plan, and TfL's second consultation on the DLR extension via Beckton Riverside to Thamesmead, all three closing next month.

but on reflection <u>not</u> Eastbourne Borough and Lewes District Councils' consultation on <u>local government reorganisation in East Sussex</u> as insufficiently of direct interest for us, or for the City of London's consideration of Network Rail Property's applications for <u>Liverpool</u> <u>Street station redevelopment</u> as closing date deferred.

- ~ on the 15th, in 1983 King's Cross Midland City re-opened (opened 1863, closed 1979, re-named King's Cross Thameslink 1988, finally closed on 9th December 2007).
- ~ on the 18th, in 2011 Southend Airport.
- ∼ on the 18th, in 2022 London Overground line extension to Barking Riverside station.
- ~ on the 23rd, in 1973 Stevenage, (second station, a mile south of the original opened in 1850 and was closed to coincide with its successor's opening).
- ~ on the 25th, in 2015, a 'soft opening' to passengers of London Overground's Hackney Interchange walkway.
